### **LUNCHEON SPEAKER – Betsy Woudenberg, CEO, IntelligenceArts**

#### **BONES, SPIES AND PARTLY CLOUDY SKIES**

In her talk Woudenberg addressed one of the central challenges in cyber security: predicting cyber threats. The central thesis of the talk asserted that organizations look at cyber security as something separate from human and physical security. This disjointed view does not utilize opportunities to use human, cyber, and physical security resources cohesively to recognize and react to threats. Woudenberg stated that people treat cyber security as "paleontology" when they should treat it as "meterology" (i.e., instead of treating cyber security as an historical and static threat it should be viewed as a current and dynamic threat which requires a variety to skills to address).
